

**Somerset County Council  
Various Roads, Frome  
in the Parish of Frome  
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2020**

Somerset County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, intends to make an Order, the effect of which will be to introduce the following temporary traffic restrictions as detailed in the Schedule below.

This Order follows an emergency notice to enable Somerset Highways to facilitate social distancing in shopping areas during Covid-19. This will come into operation on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of July 2020 and will remain in force for eighteen months.

The restrictions will only apply when indicated by traffic signs.

**Schedule**  
**Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles**

<b>Market Place (B3090) Frome</b>	From its junction with King Street, north-eastwards to its junction with Scott Road for approximately 66 metres.
<b>Catherine Hill Frome</b>	For its entire length.
<b>Palmer Street Frome</b>	For its entire length.
<b>Stoney Street Frome</b>	For its entire length.
<b>Eagle Lane Frome</b>	For its entire length.
<b>Church Street Frome</b>	For its entire length.
<b>King Street Frome</b>	For its entire length.

**Statement of reasons for making the Order**

- a) because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road, which is not attributable to such works  
or
- b) to facilitate social distancing in shopping areas during Covid-19.
