Notice is hereby given that on the 28th February 2020 Somerset County Council made an Experimental Order in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 9, 10, 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act of 1984') as amended; and the Traffic Management Act 2004, (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act of 2004') as amended, and all other enabling powers.

The effect will result in the introduction on an experimental basis the following proposed restrictions and permit cost and eligibility described in the Schedules below along Richmond Park, Bishops Hull, Taunton. The Order shall come into force on 12th March 2020 and will remain in force for a maximum of 18 months

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR MAKING THE ORDER

Proposals

The experimental introduction of various restrictions on the following road, within Taunton.

Richmond Park, Bishops Hull, Taunton No Waiting
Monday to Saturday 08.30 to 18:00 hours

Reasons

Following consultation with residents of Richmond Park it is proposed to introduce a permit parking area on an experimental basis. The permit parking area will improve congestion, reduce traffic from vehicles looking for uncontrolled parking close to Musgrove Hospital and Bridgwater and Taunton College.

The existing no waiting single yellow lines for the period Monday to Friday, 9am to 3.30pm are to be brought in line with the proposed permit parking area. The length is also being reduced slightly to increase parking capacity for residents. During the experimental period of up to 18 months reviews will be undertaken to identify whether the hours of control remain supported by residents are not excessive.

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

The specific grounds which the County Council are using for the implementation of the proposed restrictions as above, are the following sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

- Section 1 (a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other such road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.
- Section 1 (c) for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians).
- Section 1 (f) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.

In addition, consideration was given to the factors set out in Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 in proposing this Traffic Order.

Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016

All the associated signing will be in accordance with traffic signs regulations and general directions 2016.

Equality Act 2010

Consideration was given to the equalities duty of the County Council under Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010.
