in the Parish of Bridgwater
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2020

Somerset County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, intends to make an Order, the effect of which will be to introduce the following temporary traffic restrictions as detailed in the Schedule below.

This Order follows an emergency notice to enable Somerset Highways to facilitate social distancing in shopping areas during Covid-19. This will come into operation on the 6th day of July 2020 and will remain in force for eighteen months.

The restrictions will only apply when indicated by traffic signs.

Schedule
Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles

St Mary Street Bridgwater	From a point 88 metres north-west of its junction with Dampiet Street, for a distance of 51 metres in a North Westerly direction (to the start of Cornhill).
Cornhill Bridgwater	For its entire length.
High Street Bridgwater	From its junction with York Buildings for a distance of 179 metres in a South Westerly direction until its junction with Lamb Lane.
York Buildings Bridgwater	For its entire length.

Statement of reasons for making the Order

- a) because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road, which is not attributable to such works
or
- b) to facilitate social distancing in shopping areas during Covid-19.
