(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)
Order 2020
The Last Bus Filming

Somerset County Council made the above Order in exercise of the provisions of Section 16 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as previously advertised on the 26th November 2020, to introduce a temporary prohibition of vehicles in the road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

The Order shall come into operation at 0600 hours on the 14th December 2020 and will continue in force until 2200 hours on 14th December 2020.

The Order has been made to facilitate filming of The Last Bus and is in the interest of public safety.

Exemptions are provided in the Order for emergency vehicles, residents requiring access and egress and any vehicles associated with the event.

From its junction with Priddy Road, northwards to its junction with Roemead Road for a distance of 2450 metres.

Statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order

- a) because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the road
- b) because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road, which is not attributable to such works
